Christine will be painting in oils and talking to us about "Music and My Art Life".

Christine White is a Redlands-based artist, having lived in SoCal for 15 years but originally from South Carolina. She is fascinated with music, geography, our sense of place, and using creativity collectively to make our communities better. Over the years, she had a few different occupations but always created in art in some form. Getting serious about painting in 2010 led to opening her full-time art business in 2019. The business creates original oil paintings, commissions, workshops/mentoring, and live painting.

The paintings themselves are colorful portrayals of local imagery: landscapes, events, plants, and creatures. These are paired with surreal themes, usually related to music and appreciation of nature. Christine strongly believes her paintings aren't complete until they find their person. When she hears the story of why someone is drawn to a painting, that significantly adds to the meaning of the piece. This art-viewer relationship is true magic.

# President's Message



### Welcome back, everyone!

So? Did you all have a good summer? I hope I get to hear some stories of travel, family gatherings, and how much you painted – this can happen when we get together on SEPTEMBER 11 TH for our first meeting of 2023-24! Yay!

And I'm excited that our first demonstrator is the effervescent and ultratalented CHRISTINE WHITE from Redlands. It's gonna be fun, folks!

Some news and some changes, though, since we last saw each other. I believe I mentioned the Guideline changes made by the Board (not by-law changes) at the June meeting but let me repeat them here:

- 1. NUMBER OF ENTRIES ALLOWED PER MEMBER: ONE ENTRY per member will be allowed into each of the following categories: ORIGINAL, NON-ORIGINAL AND PHOTOGRAPHY. This means you may enter three pieces at each meeting, ONE per the above categories. (There is no change to the Master's Category Master artists are allowed/encouraged to enter two pieces in the Master's category only.)
- 2. ONE CATEGORY ELIMINATED: The MULTI-MEDIA category has been eliminated. Any work of art that includes multiple mediums (combinations of ink/acrylic/oil/gold flake, for example) should be entered into the ORIGINAL category.
- 3. VISITOR POLICY CHANGE: The Board decided to create an actual ruling regarding VISITORS:

First time visitors – free! Second-time visitors - \$10 fee/person. Third-time visitors – required to register and pay full membership fee. It's not our intention to scare away newcomers but we feel that you all pay to see our demonstrators, it's only fair that a return visitor should do the same.


Your paper tour guide map will be your ticket for entry to the various studios.
